The Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) of Dane County helps older adults and people with disabilities — along with their families and caregivers— connect with the resources and services they need to live as safely and independently as possible.

- ⇒ Our staff will help you identify and understand your long and short-term care options. We will provide in-depth information about private-pay services and resources available to meet your current and future needs.
- ⇒ The ADRC is the entry point for publicly-funded programs that help pay for long-term care. Based on your eligibility, our staff will complete assessments, make referrals and/or enrollments into long-term care programs.
- ⇒ Our Benefit Specialists explain how to apply for publically-funded benefits and help you cut through the "red tape" when applying for Medicare and Social Security.
- ⇒ Our High School Transition Team provides assistance to students with disabilities and their families as they prepare for life after high school.
- ⇒ We can connect with prevention programs to help you stay healthy, avoid injury and retain your independence.

Dane County's Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) is here for all Dane County residents to use, regardless of income or personal resources. Our services are funded by the State of Wisconsin.



The ADRC empowers people to make informed choices about services and supports.
